Purpose of Report

To accept the recommendations of the Community Grants Assessment Committee and award the Community Grants for 2020/21 year.

Background

Council has developed the Community Grants Program to provide a transparent and accountable system of distributing funds by application, to community groups, organisations and individuals to assist in the development and implementation of innovative initiatives. The grants assist the local community in achieving community development principles and to further contribute to the betterment and the well-being of the citizens of Katherine and the enhancement of our environment.

The Community Grants Scheme was open from the 13 July 2020 to the 20 August 2020. A total of 20 applications were received, fourteen (14) for the Community Groups Minor Grants category and six (6) for the Major Events category.

The Community Grants Assessment Committee met on Thursday 20 August 2020 to assess the applications received. The notes from the meeting (outlining the recommended recipients for the 2020/21 Community Grants) are attached.

Following the awarding of the grants all applicants will be notified of the outcome with successful applicants provided with funding agreements.

Financial Implications

Council has a budget allocation of \$40,000 for Community Grants for the 2020/21 financial year. This allocation is available to meet assessed projects across two categories of submissions – Grants for Community Organisations of up to \$2,000; and Grants for major events of up to \$5,000.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Council approval to authorise the Mayor and CEO to affix the common seal and sign the Request to Issue Certificate as to Title Lot 509, Katherine (Form 104) pertaining to this report.

This is in relation to DP20-0147 Lot 509 Town of Katherine, 20 Katherine Terrace, Town of Katherine – Town Square T20-03 – Katherine CBD Revitalisation

BACKGROUND

As part of DP20-0147, Schedule of Condition, Conditions Precedent, Section 3 & 4: The owner of the land must enter into agreements with the relevant authorities for the provision of related infrastructure and services to the land in accordance with the authorities' requirements and relevant legislation at the time.

Any developments on or adjacent to any easements on site shall be carried out to the requirements of the relevant service authority to the satisfaction of the consent authority.

Power and Water sought Confirmation of Easement to be Extinguished – Lot 509. Form 104 to be tabled at forthcoming Katherine Town Council Meeting Power and Water have sought endorsement of Form 104, Request to Issue Certificate as to Title Lot 509, Katherine which has been annexured with this report.

By having this form, Form 104 signed by the required parties with a Common Seal endorsement will ensure Katherine Town Council is compliant with the Development Permit DP20-0147.

Report

In order to be compliant with the Development Permit DP20-0147, Schedule of Conditions, Condition Precedent 3 & 4, Council will need to affix the common seal and authorise the Mayor and CEO to sign the Agreement.

SCHEDULE OF CONDITIONS

- 1. The works carried out under this permit shall be in accordance with the drawings numbered 2020/0056/01 2020/0056/06
- 2. The use and development as shown on the endorsed plans must not be altered without the further consent of the consent authority.
- The owner of the land must enter into agreements with the relevant authorities for the provision of related infrastructure and services to the land in accordance with the authorities' requirements and relevant legislation at the time.
- 4. Any developments on or adjacent to any easements on site shall be carried out to the requirements of the relevant service authority to the satisfaction of the consent authority.
- 5. Storage for waste disposal bins is to be provided to the requirements of Katherine Town Council to the satisfaction of the consent authority.
- 6. The use and development must be managed so that the amenity of the area is not detrimentally affected, through the:
 - (a) transport of materials, goods or commodities over the site by vehicles
 - (b) emission of noise, artificial light, vibration, smell, fumes, smoke, vapour, steam, soot, ash, dust, waste water, waste products, grit or oil
 - (c) presence of vermin
- 7. The owner shall:
 - (a) remove disused vehicle and/ or pedestrian crossovers;
 - (b) provide footpaths/ cycleways as required;
 - (c) collect stormwater and discharge it to the drainage network; and
 - (d) undertake reinstatement works;
 - all to the technical requirements of and at no cost to Katherine Town Council, to the satisfaction of the consent authority.
- 8. The finish of any signage, if erected, shall be such that, if illuminated, day and night readability is the same and is of constant display (i.e. not flashing or variable message).

The sign shall be positioned:

- (a) so as not to create sun or headlight reflection to motorists; and
- (b) be located entirely (including foundations and aerially) within the subject lot.
- 9. Advertising signage, either permanent or temporary, e.g. 'A' frame, vehicle or trailer mounted shall not be erected or located within the Stuart Highway or any road reserve.
 - External lighting must be designed, baffled and located so as to prevent any adverse effect on adjoining land to the satisfaction of the consent authority.

The loading and unloading of goods from vehicles must be undertaken from a designated car parking space or loading space and shall not disrupt the free flow of traffic.

NOTES

- 1. The Power and Water Corporation advises that the Power Network Engineering Section (powerdevelopment@powerwater.com.au) should be contacted via email a minimum of 1 month prior to construction works commencing in order to determine the Corporation's servicing requirements, and the need for upgrading of on-site and/or surrounding infrastructure.
- 2. Food premises shall be designed, constructed, registered and operate in accordance with the Building Code of Australia, the *Public and Environmental Health Act 2011* and Regulations 2014, the *Food Act 2004* and National Food Safety Standards.
- 3. The Department of Environment and Natural Resources advises that construction work should be conducted in accordance with the Northern Territory Environment Protection Authority's Noise Guidelines for Development Sites. The guidelines specify that on-site construction activities are restricted to between 7am and 7pm Monday to Saturday and 9am to 6pm Sunday and Public Holidays. For construction activities outside these hours refer to the guidelines for further information.

- The Registrar-General must issue a certificate containing the indefeasible title for a lot at the written request of the registered owner. However, if the lot is subject to a registered mortgage, the Registrar-General may issue the certificate as to title only if the mortgagee consents to the issue of the certificate. If an instrument has been lodged to register an interest in the lot, the Registrar-General may refuse to issue the certificate as to title until the instrument has been registered.
