Report

Downes Gradeways are requesting a letter of support from Katherine Town Council to present the names of "Stacey" and "Inskip" to the Northern Territory Place Names Committee as the names for two streets in the Casuarina Park Estate, Katherine. Downes Graderways have provided letters from both families, detailing the historical significance of the persons after whom the streets are to be named and a map of the proposed streets to be named in the Casuarina Park Estate. Downes Graderways have checked with the Place Names Register and found no similar names exist within the Municipality.

Council is asked to consider the proposed names and if approved, authorise the CEO to provide Downes Gradeways with a letter of support to be submitted with their application to the NT Place Names Committee.

It should be noted that, place names are not finalised until an instrument has been signed by the Minister and the details of the instrument have been added to the Place Names Register.

Leonard Esmonde Stacey (Bomber) was born in a tent under a Bauhinia tree at Newcastle Waters on 19th February 1942.

He received the nickname "Bomber" as he was born on the day Darwin was bombed. He was 1 of 8 children of Norman and Caroline Stacey who were Pioneering Drovers of the Northern Territory.

Bomber was sent to boarding school in Alice Springs at the "Our Lady of the Sacred Heart" convent. He left school at the age of 12 (1954) to help his older brothers work their fathers' droving plant after his father passed away.

In 1961 he left droving and worked on Barkly Station as a truck driver.

He left Barkly Station in 1963 to work with his brother Kelly who was working for Windy Alright. He drove Windys' AEC truck subbying for Noel Buntine carting cattle from Wyndham, Mistake Creek and the now Lake Argyle area. (The area wasn't known as Lake Argyle back then).

Bomber then moved on to work for Buntine Roadways driving road-trains from Wyndham W.A. to Brisbane Qld, carting oil rigs, cattle, fuel, freight & hot bitumen. After nine (9) years he then went to work for Lyn (Shorty) Hayes carting cattle.

Finally in 1979, dad (Bomber) went to work for the Northern Territory Government taking maintenance crews all over the N.T. doing repair work on schools & police station out in the remote area settlements & stations.

Dad passed away 9th June 2009 at the age of 67.

From horseback to road trains, dad (Bomber) help open up the Territory, moving supplies & resources etc. all over the Territory, Northern WA & Qld. He saw a lot of changes & enjoyed every moment of his life in the bush.

Bomber lived in Katherine from 1963 to 1999 and everybody knew him.

While the "Stacey" name is well known throughout the Northern Territory, dad's nickname "Bomber" is the name he was known by & very few knew dad as Len.

We would be proud to have a street / road named after our father & I know he would find it humbling that his name should be nominated.

Errol Eric Inskip was born in Rockhampton on 14th November 1947.

Errol moved to the Territory at a young age with 3 of his brothers – John, Bimbo and Kenny, where he went to work for Dillingham as a grader operator on the Carpentaria Highway. Errol then worked at Frances Creek mine for quite some time before moving to Darwin building roads with Henry and Walker and various other civil construction contractors.

In his later years, Errol worked for Katherine company Downes Graderways with another top operator and mate, Trevor Cormack (Cormack St) where they spent most of their time upgrading the Victoria Highway, and Errol had fond memories of his time on the Vic until his passing. Errol was well respected for his work ethics, dedication and abilities.

Errol was also a key operator for new alignments in virgin country for access and mine haul roads including 65km to the Merlin Diamond Mine and 60km from the Bootu Creek Mine to the Stuart Highway and on to the railhead.

One of his last stints was construction work in Vietnam where he was also well valued.

Errol did not have any children of his own, but instead took many young fellas including his nephews under his wing on various civil projects both in town and out bush.

Errol passed away on the 1st August 2008.

The Inskip family are very proud of the nomination for a road name in memory of Errol, and we think Errol would be both humbled and honoured.
