### **Order of Business:**

# • Terms of Reference (TOR) – discussion

- Secretariat duties were agreed to remain with DCM.
- The group otherwise was happy with the amended ToR. It was also noted that some members emailed their approval.

# Senate PFAS Sub Committee "Inquiry into the management of PFAS contamination in around Defence bases" – Discussion

- Members discussed the report and recommendations.
- Members noted how their recommendations and goals in the revised ToR 'Dove-tailed' nicely into the recommendations made in this report.
- Some members noted they had not read the document and asked for web link.

#### Members and Invitees

- o Group noted there was a need to advertise for new members.
  - Members promised to circulate and network within their own circles
  - Members agreed that an Expression of Interest advertisement should be circulated via print and social media seeking new members should the revised ToR be approved by the IASC.
- Group discussed the need to get more 'high profile' attendees at the meetings
  - Personal invitations to the Member for Katherine, Member for Lingiari and Senators for the Northern Territory to be distributed at a later date.
  - This could involve a standard letter of invitation
    - It would be signed from the independent co-chair from the public.

- Stakeholders such as banks and real estate agents are other possible invitees.
- Members discussed site remediation at Tindal and requested further information regarding the contractor and current status of works.
  - This directly related to the short term goals of the group and updates from this source could lead to useful KPI's

**Action**: Members seeking an update on the status of Department of Defence Community Consultation activities. Are any future community consultation or information sessions scheduled; will Department of Defence be evaluating consultation activities undertaken to date?

- It was suggested that RAAF representative Tim Ferrell was a permanent member and attended meetings whenever possible.
- The group would vote on members, capping at 15 in the event that excessive applicants apply.
